Many **HERBS** can be easily brought inside to give you fresh herbs all winter. Come talk to us about creating an edible *inside* container garden!!



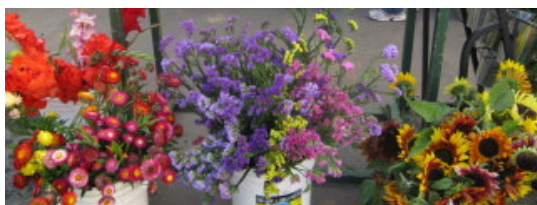
